Thanks from St Saviours Priory who will distribute the tins and goods collected from the school and church. These will be distributed to the homeless and families in need via the Dunloe centre in the coming months. Thanks also from The Hackney Foodbank who have been able to provide 242 meals for people in crisis from the joint collection which weighed just over 100kg!

How can you support learning at home?

As you know the details for homework can be found on the school website. You can also find it by tapping [here](#). On the homework link you can find the spellings that the children need to learn each week, the IXL focus area for the week and the topic project for them to complete at home. Most children are accessing IXL through an app however you get additional features when you log into IXL through a web browser. As a parent or career when you log onto IXL, through a web browser, using your child's username and password you will see that there is an area called National Curriculum. When you select National Curriculum it will open a new page where the different parts of IXL are mapped against the National Curriculum statements for Maths and English. To ensure that you are looking at the correct area for your child you will need to select the key stage your child is in and then their year group. You will then see if your child has mastered any of the areas that link directly to the National Curriculum. If they have not they can click on the link and it will take them directly to that area. If you notice that your child is struggling on the area that has been selected then it is worth checking to see if there is another set of questions that either build up to it in the current year group or going back to the previous year group. For example if my child was struggling on Year 4 - B.2 Place value names up to thousands, it may help them to go back to Year 4 - B.1 Place value models up to thousands or even to Year 3 - L.2 Place value models - up to hundreds.

Books, books and more books

We know people celebrate birthdays in different ways! We've been role playing celebrating a birthday by having a picnic just like one of Miss Williams' friends did this year.




RECEPTION H

We are reading the Gruffalo. We went on a hunt to find clues that tell us what we are going to be learning about. We used our knowledge about rhyming words to help us find the clues.




RECEPTION T

In maths this week we have been learning to sort out groups and writing the amount.




YEAR 1 H

In PSHCE we have been celebrating our similarities and differences...we know we are very special! We discussed and drew what makes us unique and




YEAR 2 H


YEAR 2 T


YEAR 3
