## Dropping off and picking up at Holy Trinity

A number of concerns have been raised by parents, carers and staff in regard to children being dropped off and picked up. The concerns are varied and valid. Some are around the darkness at the end of the day, particularly for collection from clubs at 16:30. At this time of year it is dark at that time of the day so we ask that you enter the school gate and approach the adults dismissing so that it is clear who children are going home with. When children are called over by an adult from the gate, car or over the road it leaves adults concerned about where the child has gone, if they haven't seen them leave. Another concern is relating to the collection of children by adults from other families. We are more than happy for your children to be collected by another adult however if this is a regular occurrence please ensure that the adult has filled in the relevant form in the front office so that this adult has been added to your child's file as a person available for collection. If it is a one off please ensure that you have informed the class teacher and or the front office so that this message can be passed onto the relevant person in preparation for the end of the day. The final concern recently raised has been to do with the cars collecting and dropping children off. If you are driving around the outside of the school please ensure that you are very cautious about the speed you are using. There was one incident recently where a child was only just missed in the road by a parent who was driving up the road. Also, if you haven't already, please speak with your children about road safety. Thank you in advance for your support and understanding of the importance of this issue.

Our topic book is called 'Big Hair, Don't Care' so we decided to open our very own hair salon. Our deal of the week is a cut and blow dry for one pound!




## NURSERY AM

We've been exploring sound with our friends using different objects in the classroom.




## RECEPTION H

We have been learning all about transport. Look at us building a high train track using blocks. We also had to write a train ticket to where we were going to travel to.




## RECEPTION T

In maths we have been learning the number bonds to five and writing the calculations out.




## YEAR 1 H

## YEAR 3



