
## PRESCHOOL UNDER 2'S

We enjoyed making different marks and working together to make our masterpiece. Our friends also helped us finish our work of art.




## PRESCHOOL

In maths we have been learning about the part whole model for number bonds. We played a game where we threw 10 bean bags to learn about number bonds to 10.




## RECEPTION T

We have been learning how to plait. We discovered it is harder than it looks!




## YEAR 1T


## YEAR 3
