Through the Ages - Across Key Stage 1 and 2

This term the children in Years 1 - 6 are travelling through the ages. Year 1 are studying the history of their time, how they change as they grow and their families. Year 2 are learning about the Victorians and after half term they will have a Victorian Day. The Year 3 class have begun investigating life as Vikings while Year 4 have already begun expeditions into the Romans times. Year 5 are travelling to Ancient Greece while Year 6 have begun to investigate the weapons they used in the Stone Age and Iron Age. Across the term the children will be learning key facts about the time period they are studying, drawing and painting portraits and making museum artefacts. The children will then go on to use the historical skills that have developed to study other areas and key influences in history.

Celebrating Black Lives Through British History

Across the school we are using the historical skills we are learning as we move through the ages to learn more about Black British History. Each phase in the school is studying the influence that the BAME community has had on different aspects of Britain. In the EYFS they are focusing on aspirations. Years 1 and 2 are studying the impact that the BAME community has had on Science for example through inventions, discoveries and medicine. Years 3 and 4 are learning about the importance of the BAME community on the Arts, with a focus on music, art and literature. Finally in Year 5 and 6 the children are investigating the influence on Politics and Religion, they are studying key events, leaders and legislation throughout history.

The work that the children are doing will be shared across the school through our displays. We will ensure that these are shared with you through photographs once they are complete. As soon as we are able to have parents back on site we are also looking forward to celebrating our diverse school community with a cultural evening.

Home Learning Through Google Classroom

In the event that we need to close a year group or send children home due to a positive COVID test, learning can continue through the use of Google Classroom. This will be available for all school age children in Reception, Years 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6. 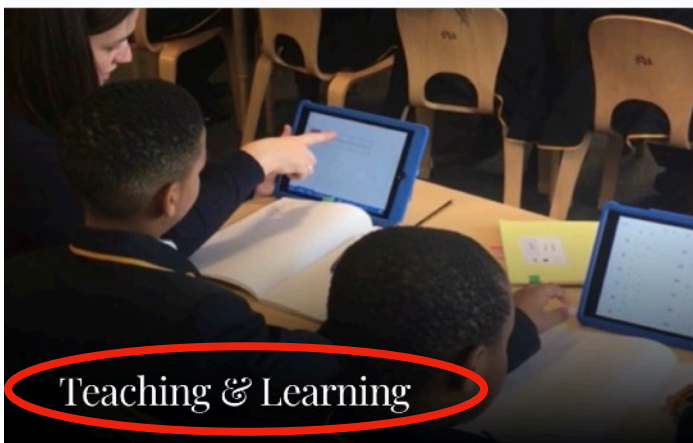

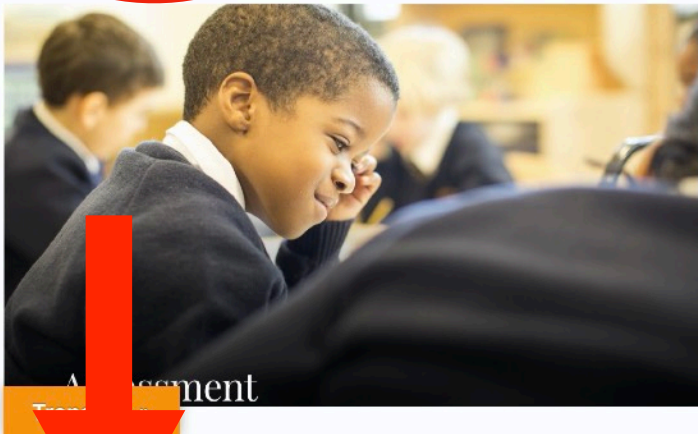
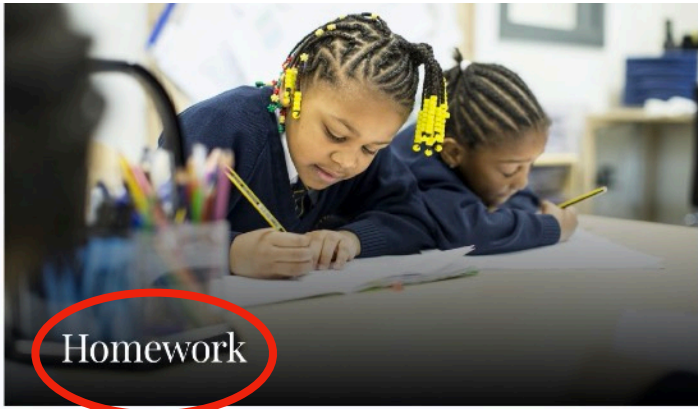

Want more practise for Maths, spelling, grammar and punctuation?

The school has bought into 2 packages that you can use at home with your child.

The first is IXL which can be accessed though either an app or the website. Children in Year 6 should be spending 90 minutes a week using IXL to consolidate learning in school, Year 5 - 80 minutes, Year 4 - 70 minutes, Year 3 - 60 minutes, Year 2 - 50 minutes and Year 1 - 40 minutes. If you need a reminder of your childs password please note that a letter will be coming out next week containing all the information you need.

The second is also an app called Manipulatives or can be accessed through the brainingcamp website. The app is used in school during lessons to help children understand and consolidate new concepts taught. Access to this at home means that they can use the same tools to complete tasks at home with you.
