Christmas Cards We have had a few questions about Christmas cards this year. Many people are choosing not to send them this year due to the number of hands they pass through as the cards are handled. However we have a plan if you do really want to send cards to staff or children at Holy Trinity. There will be a box at each of the gates through which children arrive from Monday 7th December and will be there until Friday 11th December. As of Friday 11th we will no longer accept cards. The reason being is that they will sit in quarantine and then be distributed to classes. Please ensure that all cards if you are sending them have the name and class of the child that you are sending them to. Due to GDPR we are not allowed to give out class lists so please don't ask for those from staff.

Face Coverings for Drop Off and Collection A reminder to all parents and carers that we are asking you to

wear a face mask at the school gates and in the front office. This is to help reduce the risk to those around you and to our staff members. If you are coming into the school, past the reception desk, for any kind of meeting please ensure that you scan the QR code at the front entrance. It will ask you a few questions that are related to our COVID risk assessment. It will only take a few minutes and it is in place to safeguard the children and staff on site, we thank you in advance for doing this.

Rapid Closure Protocol Reminder A reminder that a Rapid Closure Protocol has been written which we will follow in the event that we

need to close suddenly. If this is activated we will make contact with all parents. You must ensure that you are easily contactable whilst your child is at school. If the school needs to close rapidly it may mean you are given no notice and that you are asked to collect your child immediately.

COVID Update In the event that your child has COVID symptoms or has been told to isolate for other reasons it is crucial that you follow these guidelines immediately and you do not return

your child to school until they have either tested negative or have completed their period of isolation. If you are awaiting COVID test results you must not come to school under any circumstances. A reminder that in the event that we need to close a year group or send children home due to a positive COVID test, learning can continue through the use of Google Classroom. This will be available for all school age children in Reception, Years 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6. Letters were sent out in October that contained the information you need to log into your Childs Google Classroom account and their username and password for IXL - if you need that information again please let

us know as soon as possible.
