Religious Education Science Hinduism: <u>Living Things in their Habitats:</u>

- Recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways
- Explore and use classification keys to group, identify and name a variety of living things in their local and wider environment
- Recognise that environments can change & this can pose a threat to living things.

Electricity:

- Identify common appliances that run off electricity
- Construct a simple series circuit, identifying and naming its basic parts, including cells, wires, bulbs, buzzers and switches
- Identify whether or not a lamp will light in a simple circuit, based on whether the lamp is part of a complete loop with battery
- Recognise that a switch opens and closes a circuit and associate this with whether or not a lamp lights in a simple series circuit
- Recognise some common conductors and insulators and associate metals as being good conductors
