Psalm 30 This song was written by King David, over a thousand years before the resurrection and Peter's encounter with Jesus on the beach. Verse 5 could be applied to Peter and Jesus' forgiveness of him (remember Peter had denied ever knowing Jesus before the crucifixion) and verse 11 a possible description of how Peter might have felt after his conversation with Jesus. At the beginning of the Gospel Jesus calls Peter to 'Follow me!' and Jesus repeats this again. Peter is affirmed, forgiven and has a fresh start. Psalm 23 This song was written by King David, who had been a shepherd as a boy. He knew what was needed to look after sheep and describes God in those same terms. Acts 9:36-43 Peter has been told to continue the work of Jesus, the good shepherd. Peter discovers that raising the dead was not just part of Jesus' ministry. 15 June 2025 Trinity Sunday (The only major Sunday in the church calendar that celebrates a doctrine rather than an event.)	Romans 5:1-5 Paul writes to the church in Rome. He expresses something of the work of the Trinity in salvation. Because of faith in Jesus, there is an opportunity to be justified (made right) and live at peace with God the Father and the Holy Spirit makes it possible to experience God's love. John 16:12-15 Jesus spoke to his disciples before his death about the Holy Spirit, the third person of the Trinity. Jesus explains something of the complex nature of the Trinity. There is only one God, and yet the Father, Son and Holy Spirit work in different ways, but co-operate and serve one another.
